Host Hotel

The Capitol Plaza Hotel was headquarters to the 2002 AACA Central Fall Meet & Tour so they are very familiar with the AACA Meets. Registration will be at the hotel Wednesday through Saturday morning. Round table discussion, Judge's School, Judge's Breakfast, and Saturday's Banquet all will be at the Capitol Plaza Hotel.

Show Field

The show field is south of the Capitol Plaza Hotel in the parking area for the Expo Centre; a distance of a block and a half.

Thursday, September 17, 2009

Silo/Castle Tour

"Oh where have all the missile silo's gone."
A typical silo cost 3 million in "1960's" dollars and the government built hundreds of them, many around Topeka. We think you will enjoy touring this silo turned into a home.



Our second stop will be at a castle that was built by a Frenchman who escaped the guillotine and fled to America with his family. He died before he could complete the castle. The vineyards are being replanted as they were in his day. We will have you back in time for the Round Table (members opportunity to ask questions about AACA and the future) and Judge's School. Lunch will be on your own.

Friday, September 18, 2009

After the AGNM we will travel to the Kansas Historical Museum for a BBQ dinner. You will be able to tour the museum, which features Kansas cars and the *"Need for Speed"* in Kansas. A number of early cars were manufactured in Kansas, Walter Chrysler was born here, and the National Hot Rod Association held its first national championship in the state. President Dwight Eisenhower, a Kansas native, championed the interstate highway system. Cash Bar available.

Saturday, September 19, 2009

The Central Fall Meet begins. All cars must be in place by 11:00 a.m. Ladies Tour will leave the host hotel for a tour of the refurbished interior of our State House. There are murals throughout the Statehouse; some are the paintings of John Stewart Curry. Next will be a tour of the First Presbyterian Church to view the Tiffany stained glass windows which bring visitors from all over the world. We will have a luncheon and then return to the host hotel.
